MAY 25TH VISITING PRIEST


The Reverend Edward Day is a priest in the Church of England. Currently, he is serving as the assistant curate at Wells Cathedral – one of the smallest cities in England. Edward was born in Bristol, in the southwest of England, and studied politics at university. While working in local government, on heritage regeneration projects, Edward continued studying for his masters in canon law. In 2019, Reverend Day was accepted to train for ordained ministry and studied at Ripon College, Cuddesdon. During his time at Cuddesdon, he read theology at the University of Oxford and did a master's in church history. Alongside his ministry, Edward is also studying for a doctorate on church-state relations.

Edward and his partner, Natalie, who is from Texas and sings in the Choir at Wells Cathedral, are visiting Montana for a wedding. Edward has expressed his excitement at visiting St. Peter's and Montana. This is his first time visiting the United States and we are grateful to have him visit our Cathedral.
