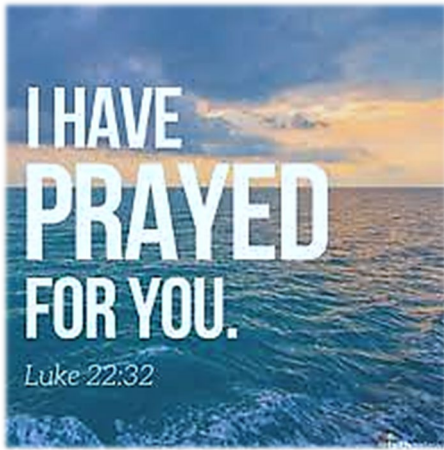

The ramp project is coming along. We now have the updated architectural drawings. The drawings have been submitted to the City for permitting. The contractor is working on an updated bid for the project. Due to workforce shortage, the completion may take sometime.

We continue to raise funds. St Peters Health recently approved a \$5000 donation.

The Heart of Helena Art Show and Auction scheduled for April 2025 is also in full planning mode. We are seeking business sponsors for the event. We will begin asking the congregation and the community for art donations in August. We will also be asking for volunteers to help plan and conduct the event.
