WONDERFUL WEDNESDAYS IN SUMMERTIME

Wonderful Wednesdays will continue into the summer with a discussion of David Brooks' new book, "How to Know a Person." Our former dean, Steve Brehe, will lead five sessions. As followers of Christ, we are called to love and understand others as God does. Brooks' insights to deepen our faith journey.

Here is the format:

Potluck in the undercroft starting at 5:30 on Wednesday evenings. Bring a dish to share.

The discussion of the book runs from 6:00 to 7:00.

There will be five sessions:

June 11: Learning to See People Deeply, focusing on "Deep attention, presence, and intentional seeing" (Introduction along with Chapters 1–2).

June 25: Moving Past the Surface, focusing on moving beyond small talk; asking meaningful, story-inviting questions (Chapters 3–4).

July 9: The Humble Practice of Empathy, focusing on empathy, humility, and moral imagination (Chapters 5–6).

July 23: Stories That Shape Us, focusing on identity through storytelling and sacred listening (Chapters 7–8).

Aug. 13: Becoming a Person of Illumination, focusing on building a culture of seeing, and spiritual vocation (Chapters 9–Conclusion).

Copies of the book are available in a variety of formats, including print, electronic, and audio. Having a book is recommended.
