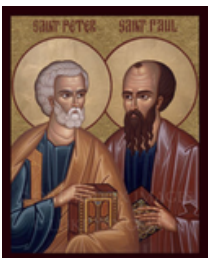

SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, MARTYRS

Peter, the passionate fisherman, and Paul, the brilliant scholar, were fiercely different men who became the twin pillars of the early Church. Though they occasionally clashed, their shared, radical love for Christ united them. Both were martyred in Rome, leaving a legacy of courage that shaped Western Christianity. Each of them gets their own special day, plus together on June 28.
