Worship News: Togendowagan Spirit Society



Walking the Circle, A Reflection

At the heart of the Pow Wow is a sacred circle, a place where heaven touches earth, and the Spirit moves through song, dance, and prayer. It is a "thin place," where the boundary between the earthly and the divine is lifted, and we are invited to reflect and connect.

We gather not just to celebrate culture, but to honor the Creator who breathes life into every drumbeat and every step. The Grand Entry is more than a procession; it is a living testimony: We are still here. Led by veterans, elders, and finalized by our future, our youth, it marks the beginning of a sanctified time: a time of remembrance, healing, and joy.

Each dancer's regalia is a prayer in motion. Hand-stitched beadwork, feathers, and fringe tell stories of survival, ceremony, and identity. These garments (regalia) are not costumes; they are sacred expressions of heritage, crafted with love and worn with reverence.

The dances speak in ancient languages of the land, each one offering its own message of faith, resilience, and connection:

- Men's Traditional Dance reflects the grounded strength of warriors and hunters, honoring their sacred role in protecting the people.
- · Women's Traditional Dance moves with grace and dignity, echoing the quiet power of matriarchs and caregivers.
- Fancy Dance, performed by both men and women, is a vibrant, high-energy expression of joy, filled with spins, jumps, and radiant regalia that celebrate life's vitality.
- Grass Dance, with its flowing fringe and swaying motion, mimics the wind-blown prairie and reminds us of the Spirit's gentle presence.
- Jingle Dress Dance, born of a healing vision, carries prayers with every step, the sound of metal cones like rain falling on dry ground.
- Chicken Dance, mimics the prairie chicken's movements with humor and reverence, reminding us that laughter, too, is sacred.
- Round Dance invites all to join hands, elders, youth, strangers, and kin, all moving together in unity.

In this circle, we are reminded that reconciliation is not just a word—it is a rhythm. It is the heartbeat of community, the breath of the Spirit, and the call to walk together in love.

"For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." Matthew 18:20. This verse affirms the sacredness of community, whether in a church pew or a pow wow circle. It reminds us that Creator is present whenever we gather in love and purpose. And as we gather: elders and youth, dancers and witnesses, we remember the promise - May the Creator continue to dwell among us, in every drumbeat, every prayer, and every step we take toward healing. Aho.





Project Warmth

We are joining two Helena Churches - Plymouth Congregational and St. John's Lutheran Church in a venture called Project Warmth. The goal of Project Warmth is to purchase tents, sleeping pads and tarps in addition to sleeping bags for our homeless brothers and sisters. It is a small but important effort to keep people, many of them children, warm and safe during the winter.

As usual, our tax-deductible donations will be used to purchase new goods. The gifts will be given to Our Place's outreach coordinator, Ryan Galliher, to distribute. Ryan works daily with people on the street and understands their needs. Our Place is a part of Good Samaritan ministries. In the last 8 months Our Place has supported over 150 homeless people, offering or directing services of health, training, therapy, housing and employment searches. Our Place's outreach program, currently located in the of Habitat for Humanity building on National Avenue, does so much to provide stability and support for our homeless population.

As we enter our season of cold weather, sleeping bags, tents, tarps and sleeping pads are a welcome gift to our neighbors in desperate need. Project Warmth's campaign for funds to purchase new goods is scheduled for the month of October. In each of the last two years donations have provided funds to purchase over 100 sleeping bags. Together in this joint effort we should be able to do so much more. Thank you for the support of St. Peter's, St. John's and Plymouth's congregations. "

Funds placed in the donation tin are designated for St. Peter's Social Concerns Committee to provide outreach and support to local nonprofit service agencies in our community. Family Promise

Family Promise of Helena is dedicated to helping families find education, support, and to build a road to wellness and sustainable independence by utilizing the support of the community. The program started in New Jersey in 1986 by one woman, Karen Olson and currently has over 160 affiliate cities in 42 states, including 5 cities in Montana. Family Promise of Greater Helena started in 2011 and partners with Broadwater County.

Twelve churches plus Carroll College work together in Helena. It becomes more difficult for St. Peter's and its partner church the Cathedral of St. Helena to have enough folks to do the good work that needs to be done during each host week. We host four times yearly. Each week we need 14 overnight hosts, 4 to 5 cooks to make and deliver supper, 4 to 5 grocery buyers, someone to move the trailer with beds on the starting Sunday and the concluding Sunday, a set up crew on the first Sunday and a crew on the closing Sunday to make Wilson Hall ready for Godly Play and Sunday School. With God's help we always fill out the schedule.

Rally Sunday September 7, 2025. This is when all the ministries of the church explain their work and recruit new volunteers. We will be there to talk about Family Promise, answer any questions you may have and possibly twist your arm to be a volunteer!

Family 1 – Mom (47) and two daughters age 17 & 19. The older child has a hearing disability and is working with Lewis & Clark Literacy Council to help study for her GED. The kids are building life skills with FP, Mom continues to work with FP on life skills and budgeting. They do not have a vehicle but have been getting a ride from a

coworker. Mom is hunting for an apartment.

Family 2 – Dad (45) and 2 sons age 4 & 7. Dad works as a handyman and has plans to start a construction job soon. A parenting plan is in place where dad has boys one week, and with mom the next. They are being housed at First Christian as dad often watches the boys from 6pm – 1 am during Mom's weeks. Dad is taking steps to try to gain primary custody. The boys started school recently and had a good start.

Family 3 – Mom, Dad, son (5), daughter (4) and son (1) are staying at First Christian due to the children's high needs. Their older son started Kindergarten, their daughter has been accepted into a HeadStart program and the baby is on a HeadStart waiting list. They have a vehicle. Dad started work recently. Mom cares for the kids full time.

Family 4 - Dad and 4-year-old son. Dad has 50/50 custody. Dad is doing landscaping work and is saving for his own vehicle.

Update on Mariah and Deztani - This family received her housing choice voucher and has signed a new lease for a two bedroom trailer. Deztani is learning Lakota. We are so glad to see them doing well!

Upcoming Family Promise events:

Winter Craft & Bake Sale - Family Promise is looking to hold a winter craft market at First Christion Church one Saturday a month starting this fall/winter. They are asking if the churches would want to bake and sell baked good at this event to help support Family Promise. The churches would be the only ones selling baked goods at the event to limit competition and help boost their sales. This is a fun opportunity for us to work together, and use our culinary talents while helping support this agency. If you are interested in helping, please contact Donna Church (406) 439-6811. Volunteers Needed for September Tours of the Cathedral



St. Peter's Cathedral is one of a dozen properties that will be featured on Preserve Montana's popular "Hidden Helena" tour on Saturday, September 27th, 12-5 PM. About 275 people, including 125 registrants from the statewide Montana History Conference occurring that weekend, will be provided with a map to visit the sites at their own speed. This is a wonderful opportunity to show our fellow Helenans and people from around Montana what a unique treasure our Cathedral is.

We need about ten to twelve volunteers to work two shifts, i.e five to six people to work each shift, 12 to 2.30 PM and 2.30 to 5 PM. Each volunteer will be stationed at the Cathedral's exterior, baptistry, chapel, chancel, nave and stained glass windows s/he selects. If St. Peter's cannot muster enough volunteers, Preserve Montana will seek to supplement whatever number is needed.

No memorization is required, volunteers will tell the story of the feature they are stationed at in their own words. Volunteers will be comped a ticket that gives them free access to the other sites on the tour, a \$35 value!
