JUNIOR WARDEN'S MARCH REPORT

Spring is upon us (almost)! A quick update on my activities for our Parish. I am currently focused on preparing our Cathedral/Wilson Hall for a fire department annual inspection and other life safety improvements. To date all lighted exit signs and egress lights have been replaced in the Cathedral with Wilson Hall undergoing the same work by the end of March. These lights serve to provide lighting and egress directions during an emergency or loss of power. Additional electrical work has added lighting inside and soon to be outside for the parking lot. Later this month our lower entry door to the Cathedral will be replaced with a new one that will make accessing the building easier along with a bright Episcopal red color to welcome people. I am also working to schedule floor cleaning for both buildings in areas that need good cleaning.
