### **About the Movie**

In an act of civil disobedience, a group of women and their supporters organize their ordination to become Episcopal priests in 1974. The Church of the Advocate in Philadelphia welcomes them, but change is no small task. The women are harassed, threatened and banned from stepping on church property. In this feature-length documentary film, we meet the women who succeed in building a movement that transforms an age-old institution, and challenges the very essence of patriarchy within Christendom.

**Carpeting** - Installation in the Nave / downstairs ramp, this week. The rest of the carpeting in the church will be installed in increments through the end of January.

**Ramps** – We are waiting on shipping for the railings and cabinet – Contractor expecting to be completed beginning Wed, Jan 22 and completed by the end of that week. The countertop for the new permanent cabinet will not be in place as it is not able to be ordered until the cabinets are installed. The estimated timeframe is up to 8 weeks which means the countertop installation will run into late February 2025. However, the cabinet will be available for use.
